PARSHA OUTLINE BY CANTOR VOGEL

MISHPATIM

1. There are 53 individual mitzvot in this week's parsha, 23 positive and 30 negative.
2. Laws about Jewish slaves/servants, male and female.
3. Laws regarding murder and murderers, injuries and compensation, damages caused by animals and property.
4. Laws in relation to theft and thieves, watchmen, seducing a woman, respect to national leaders, courts, judges and justice, and concern for widows and orphans.
5. A short summary of the laws regarding the holy days of the year.
6. Continuation of the description of the events at Mt. Sinai, concluding with Moshe ascending the mountain, where he will remain for forty days and forty nights.

MAFTIR: SHEKALIM

The law of collecting one half-shekel from each army eligible male. Traditionally this was done during the month of Adar anticipating the new Temple year calendar which began in Nissan.

HAFTORAH

The haftorah for Parshat Shekalim relates an event during the reign of King Yehoash of Judah who was a righteous King, and following the dictates of the Torah as commanded in Parashat Shekalim instituted a collection of half-shekels for *bedek habayit*, repair and refurbishing the Temple in Jerusalem.

AIPAC Israel Update

Sens. Cardin and Portman Condemn Anti-Israel U.N. Report

On February 1, U.S. Sens. Ben Cardin (D-MD) and Rob Portman (R-OH) issued a joint statement denouncing a recent U.N. Human Rights Office of the High Commissioner report that targeted companies that conduct business with Israel, but deferred listing any of them by name. The anti-Israel report includes detailed steps on its investigation of more than 200 companies, including 22 American companies, laying the groundwork to release a blacklist to boycott such companies in the future. "We strongly oppose the ongoing efforts to compile a blacklist of companies that do business in Israeli-controlled territories," the senators wrote. In 2017, Sens. Cardin and Portman, along with Reps. Peter Roskam (R-IL) and Juan Vargas (D-CA) in the U.S. House of Representatives, spearheaded the Israel Anti-Boycott Act (H.R. 1697 and S. 720). This bipartisan legislation would combat the boycott of Israel in the international arena by expanding existing U.S. anti-boycott laws to international organizations like the United Nations and the European Union. "This bipartisan legislation protects U.S. companies from unsanctioned international boycotts and preserves the space for direct negotiations between Israelis and Palestinians." The senator added that they "oppose all efforts by international organizations seeking to undermine prospects for resuming negotiations for a two-state solution between Israelis and Palestinians."
