PARSHA OUTLINE BY CANTOR VOGEL

SHELACH

1. Moshe sends twelve men, one from each tribe to scout the Land of Canaan.
2. After 40 days the spies return with a report and fruit of the Land of Canaan.
3. Ten of the spies admit to the goodness of the land, but report that the Israelites will be unable to conquer the current inhabitants of the land
4. The nation panics and forsakes the land to the consternation of G-d, Moshe, Yehoshua, and Calev.
5. G-d determines to destroy the entire nation, but is stopped by Moshe's intervention.
6. The punishment: the nation will wander the desert for forty years (total), during which all the men aged 20-60 will die, the negative spies die immediately.
7. A group decides to go up to Canaan on their own, they are decimated by the Canaanites.
8. G-d promulgates a series of laws that are to be observed only after the nation settles in the Land of Canaan, including the law of taking challah, to encourage the nation.
9. The case of the wood-gatherer (Tzelafchad, whose name is revealed elsewhere) on Shabbat.
10. The laws of tzitzit.

HAFTORAH

Our Haftorah tells of Yehoshua sending spies into the Land of Canaan to spy out the city of Yericho on the eve of attack. Yehoshua by comparison sent only two spies in secret and without fanfare. Yehoshua's spies succeed in their mission and assist him in preparing for the crossing of the Yarden and the conquest of Yericho, and the Land of Canaan.

AIPAC Israel Update

In Worst Blaze to Date, Gaza Fire Kites Destroy Vast Parts of Nature Reserve

A blaze set by Palestinian protesters along the Gaza border devastated a nature reserve inside Israel on Saturday, in what officials said was the worst day of fires since the demonstrators adopted the fire kite tactics in the last few months. Arson investigators at the Carmia reserve said the fire was most likely set by a fire kite, or possibly a balloon filled with chemicals that dripped flames along the area, Hadashot news reported. By evening, teams of dozens of firefighters and aircraft finally managed to bring the flames under control, but not before some 2,000 to 3,000 dunams (500 to 740 acres) of fields and parts of a nature reserve adjacent to Kibbutz Carmia were destroyed, as reported by the Times of Israel. In total, firefighters battled three large fires and several smaller ones along the Gaza Strip border, all believed to have been started by incendiary kites flown from the coastal enclave. Officials at the Israel Nature and Parks Authority estimated that at least one third of the Carmia reserve had been destroyed. They said it was likely the flames had caused massive damage to both the flora and the fauna in the reserve. Residents worked alongside with firefighters and soldiers to try to contain the fires, which have become almost daily occurrences since the start of the "March of Return" protests along the border at the end of March.
